

In case the proposal is accepted and you and/or your panel participants need Russian entry visas, the Organizing Committee will send you in the beginning of the year 2020 the list of documents necessary to support the visa application process at a Russian Consulate or Embassy.

The conference registration fee in Russian rubles, equivalent to \$150 (\$75 in rubles for students, citizens of African states residing in Africa, except South Africa, and accompanying persons), is to be paid in cash onsite upon arrival. The Conference participants working for the Institute for African Studies official partners are waved from registration fee. No other participant or an accompanying persons can be waved from registration fee.

The Organizing Committee can assist in booking accommodation, but independent reservation is encouraged. Please note that early hotel reservation is strongly recommended, as Moscow hotels and hostels may be full any season. «Russia's political and economic ties in the Mediterranean»

Election results in Zimbabwe

On July 30 2018 Presidential and parliamentary elections were held in the Republic of Zimbabwe. These were the first elections after Robert Mugabe, who led the country for 37 years, retired from his presidency in November 2017, and the first elections after the death in February 2018 of Morgan Tsvangirai, who was a leader of the opposition for 18 years.

The ruling party ZANU-PF (the African National Union of Zimbabwe - Patriotic Front) won the parliamentary elections since the 1980s, as a result gaining 145 seats in the legislative assembly out of possible 210

(another 60 seats are women's quota elected by proportional system). 63 seats in single-mandate constituencies went to the opposition Alliance of the Movement for Democratic Change (MDC-Alliance). [Read more](#)

South Africa - chairman of the BRICS

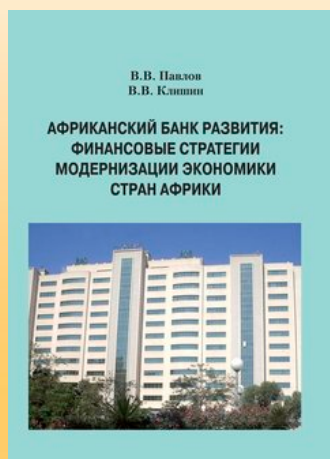
On January 1, 2018, the BRICS chairmanship went from China to South Africa, from the largest in terms of population, and now in terms of GDP member country of this association, to the smallest in both indicators. This circumstance raised doubts that after the success of Beijing, who invested for a sake of it enormous resources, both intellectual and material, Pretoria (or, more precisely, Tswane, as the capital of South Africa is now called) will cope with the role of chairman. The situation was complicated by the fact that several days before the

«changing of the guard» president of this country, Jacob Zuma, resigned as the leader of the ruling party - the African National Congress (ANC), and Cyril Ramaphosa was elected the new party president at the ANC conference, but not the ex-wife of Zuma Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma, in support of which Zuma spoke publicly.

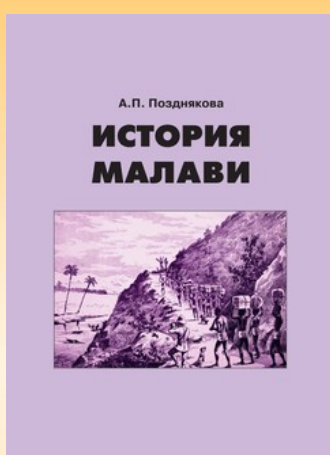


Monograph of Doctor of Economics Pavlova V.V. «Investment codes of African countries: a methodology of analysis and practical application»

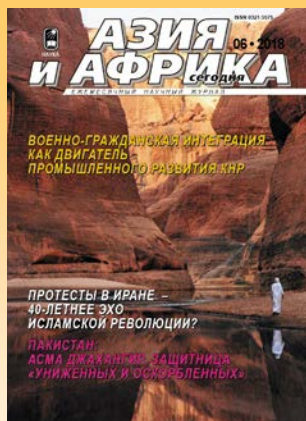
