Vasily Solodovkikov 95th anniversary

On March 13, 2013 there was a celebration for the 95th anniversary of Vasily G. Solodovnikov, the Director of the Institute from 1964 to 1976. The event was attended by the Institute scholars.


In 1964-1976 Vasily Solodovnikov served as the director of the Institute for African Studies of the USSR Academy of Sciences and as the vice-president of the international Africanists' Congress in 1965–1973. Most of his publications are devoted to socio-economical and political issues in developing countries. Doctor Honoris causa of the <u>University of Lagos</u> (Nigeria). In 1976-1981 served as an Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the USSR to the Republic of Zambia. Awarded with an Order of the Red Banner of Labour and different medals.

Publications

On 20th of March 2013 in the context of meeting dedicated to International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (celebrated all over the world since 1966 in accordance with the UN General Assembly resolution) there was the presentation of scientific compilation "The History of Africa in biographies" edited by A. Davidson. The meeting was held as a round table discussion including the authors of the monograph, the representatives of the African Embassies in the Russian Federation, the UN Information Centre in Moscow, the Russian Foreign Ministry, the Institute for African Studies and other governmental and nongovernmental organizations, funds, and the media.

Among the authors are the following scholars from the Institute for African Studies: A. Arkhangelskaya, Y. Vinokurov, V. Gribanova, L. Prokopenko, N. Rodionova, A. Savateev, O. Teterin, A. Tokarev, S. Shlenskaya. The Deputy Director for Research Prof. D. Bondarenko gave an opening speech.

As a result of the «Racism, xenophobia, discrimination. How we did see them» seminar organized in 2010 by the Center of history and cultural anthropology of the Institute in collaboration with the Fondation Maison des sciences de l'homme and French-Russian cultural center in Moscow, the book of collected of the same name was published in March 2013 (editor – E. Demintseva).

The book depicts the phenomenons of racism, xenophobia and discrimination as complex topical issues and burning socio-political matters at the same time.

The first chapter of the symposium is devoted to the different theoretical approaches to the studies of these issues.

In the second chapter the phenomenons are analyzed on the examples of several case studies based on the results of field research in Russia and Europe (particularly in France).



Π ITAR-TASS press-conference

January 24, 2013 the press conference «Integration of Russia into the Afro-Arab region» was held in the conference hall of the ITAR-TASS. The keynote speaker was the director of the Institute, Alexey Vasiliev.

Vasiliev told about Russian political and business circles interests towards the African continent.

In the nearby future he predicts the appearance of African «lions» as fastdeveloping Asian «tigers» that might occur as a result of conflicts and crises.


Part of the press conference was devoted to the Middle East issues: the director of the Institute gave an expert assessment of the current situation in Syria, Jordan, Lebanon.

Alina Lapushkina's fieldwork in Ghana, December 2012 - January 2013.

On the 1st of December 2012 the second expedition to Avatime people of Ghana commenced. The research fellow of the Centre of Information and International Relations Alina Lapushkina took part in 2 projects organized by missionaries living in Ghana.

The first project was dedicated to the Ghanaian children. The bright presentations with the humanitarian aid distribution for children were held in every Avatime school. The second part of the expedition was devoted to the project «Avatime History». The aim of this work was to fix and record the historical oral tradition of Avatime in general and of each village in particular. Further results of the research will be translated into the local language and published.

Avatime are one of the indigenous small numbered peoples of Ghana. The main area of their residence is 8 villages in the south-east of the country (the Volta region).



In March, through the high mediation of the Embassy of the Russian Federation to the Republic of Uganda and the <u>Embassy of the Republic of Uganda in Moscow</u>, the Institute signed a Memorandum of Understanding and Collaboration with the <u>St. Lawrence University</u> (Kampala, Uganda).

In addition, the agreement with the <u>Institute of Economics, Management and Law</u> (Kazan, Russia) was signed. The Memorandums of Understanding with the <u>Université de Lomé</u> (Togo), <u>l'Université d'Abomey-Calavi</u> (Benin) and Kazakh Ablai Khan University of International Relations and World Languages <u>KazUIR&WL</u> (Almaty, Kazakhstan) are being prepared.

Roundtable at MGIMO

The event was organized by the Institute of International Studies in conjunction with the editorial board of the «International Affairs» journal of the Russian Ministry of Foreign Affairs. The documentary «Roadmap to Apartheid» was shown at the Institute for African Studies on the 3rd of April. The film is the laureate and the winner of numerous international contests including the Milan International Film Festival 2012.

The authors drawn parallels between the apartheid in South Africa and the policy of segregation of Israel towards the Palestinians. Comparing the historical themes of Palestinian-Israeli conflict and the establishment of the regime of apartheid in South Africa, the film explores the physical and psychological aspects of segregation through the eyes of the Palestinians and South Africans.

After that the presentation of the South African children literature has taken place. 13th International Conference of Africanists (May 27-30, 2014)

On the 1st of April the Call for Panel proposals submission to the 13th Conference of Africanists «Society and Politics in Africa: Traditional, Transitional, and New» was closed. By the decision of the Organizing Committee, 58 Panels submitted by the scholars from 18 countries: Russia, Africa, Europe, Asia, North and South Americas were approved.

Since April 15th the *Call for Papers* is opened to the Panels accepted and a Free Communication Panel.

The deadline for paper proposals (in the form of abstracts within 300 words in Russian or English) is November 1, 2013. The proposals should be sent directly to the respective panel convener.

The information to be submitted alongside with the paper abstract includes full name, title, position, institutional affiliation, full mail and e-mail addresses, telephone and fax numbers.

However, in case you feel your paper does not fit any particular panel but corresponds to the Conference's general topic, you may submit your proposal to the Organizing Committee by the same date (November 1, 2013) and it will be considered for scheduling for the Free Communication Panel. Besides, if the Organizing Committee finds it reasonable to unite an appropriate number of proposals submitted for the Free Communication Panel into a thematic panel, it may establish such a panel and propose one of its prospective participants to convene it.
